From Palm to Passion: Holy Week is Coming! Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, March 28 as we recall Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, an entry that led to his last supper with the disciples and eventually his passionate death on the cross. A Maundy Thursday Seder Meal will be celebrated this year on April 1 (no fools) at 5:30 p.m. in the rear parking lot. This worship opportunity will include a modern embodiment of the last supper with traditional Mediterranean cuisine, hand washing celebration, and communion. Good Friday will be a day of reflection guided by a time lapse video of artist Tyler Hutchison painting an interpretation of our Lenten journey.

"Rooted and Reaching" Capital Project Update:

- 1. We have now raised over \$2.62 Million in pledges to date! Just under \$400,000 shy of our goal \$3 Million to do everything outlined in the Campaign Focus. Booklets and Brochures with more information are available in the church office.
- 2. The Steeple Replacement project is underway led by Bill Perkins and Sutton Tinsley. Construction is scheduled to take place this April.
- 3. The Organ Renovation project has been affirmed by Session, contracted with Foley-Baker, and will be led by Rob Cleland and Cory Whittier. The initial stages of the renovation are scheduled to begin this summer with construction to start early in 2022. The construction phase will be 12 to 14 months from start to finish.
- 4. Other projects are in the planning stages with more information to come.

Annual Stewardship Campaign Status: We have now received 185 pledges totaling close to \$634,000 for our 2021 Operating Budget! Thank you to all who have turned in their pledge. Annual Stewardship packets and pledge cards were passed out concurrently with the Capital Projects Campaign visits, so if we have missed you in any way, please know that was not our intention and let us know.
