## **Building Hospitality**

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. A few key locations may be helpful to you: Accessible Restrooms can be located down the main hallway from the Foyer. The Elevator is also located down the main hallway from the Foyer. In addition to locations, there are two supports available to worship participants should they be needed: Hearing-assist devices and Large Print Hymnals can be found in the Narthex. The Organ Returns to Worship Today! The mechanical and technical elements of the organ installation are now complete. Last week, Milo and Dave from Foley-Baker, worked to begin the tedious process of tuning and "tonally finishing" the organ. This process is slow, but perhaps most important in shaping the organ from a machine to a musical instrument. While it begins its role in worship today, the coming months will include more tonal finishing, tuning, and adjusting. The "break-in" period of the next several months may come with a mechanical hiccup or two as the many components of the organ settle into their new climate and environment.
