#### **Building Hospitality**

First, our Hospitality and Welcome Desk is a great source of information and all visitors, repeat visitors, and members too, are encouraged to stop and interact with the host or hostess present today. Second, our building is a wonderful resource, however, it can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. A few key locations may be helpful to you: Accessible Restrooms can be located down the main hallway from the Foyer. The Elevator is also located down the main hallway from the Foyer. The Nursery is located on the ground floor just outside the elevator. Wayfinding signs are also posted at all intersections throughout the building. Third, there are two supports available to worship participants should they be needed: Hearing-assist devices and Large Print Hymnals can be found in the Narthex. Fourth, please ask anyone with a nametag or wearing a robe if you need assistance in finding your way or answering other questions.

#### **Welcoming Children**

Just as Jesus welcomes the little children to come, so we welcome children of all ages in worship. We believe we are better when all members of God's family are included! In order to make the worship service as welcoming for our littlest ones as possible, we provide worship carts with a variety of resources to make a worship bag. 
#### Back to School Season is upon us!

#### CHANCEL PROJECT UPDATE!!

A new design for the chancel has been approved by Session and we have received confirmation of an expected start date for reconstruction of August 19. This date will be when Jamerson-Lewis plans to get construction underway, however, preparations are required the week of August 12 to cover the organ console and place protection over the pews. What does this mean? First, it means a new chancel is coming later this Fall! Second, it means we will need to move the location of Sunday worship to the Fellowship Hall. Therefore, the last Sunday of worship in the Sanctuary before construction will be Sunday, August 11. The first Sunday of worship in the Fellowship Hall will be Sunday, August 18. All other church ministries (Office, Sunday School, Bible Studies, etc.) will continue as scheduled in their regular spaces during this time.
