## Welcome to First Presbyterian Church-Lynchburg, VA

Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ!!! It is so wonderful to be together as we worship God this morning. I pray today that you will feel and experience God's presence with you and that the rest of this day is filled with opportunities for you to live into God's light and love in all you do and with all you may be with.

Today is Palm Sunday and it marks the start of Holy Week. The events framed by Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and his resurrection are some of the most dramatic and theologically important of the entire scriptural narrative. These days feature not only the drama of the triumphal entry, trial, last supper, and crucifixion but also poignant prayers and prophetic teachings of our Lord. Our focus today will be on the entry of Christ into Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" It is important to note the irony of this day. This is the day on which Jesus entered the city in triumph, but as a part of his journey to the cross; this is the week in which the crowd's cries of "Hosanna" would soon turn to "Crucify him!" It has become my firm belief that taking the time to recall and reflect on the powerful events throughout this week, including the Holy Week Walk, Maundy Thursday Seder Meal, and Good Friday Tenebrae, help to enhance and illuminate the life-changing, earthquaking, good news and hope of Easter. I pray you will join me in the journey this week.

Many opportunities abound here at First Presbyterian Church of Lynchburg to engage, impact, and expect. Engage in the life and ministries of God's church and mission. Impact our neighbors by sharing the love and light of Christ. Expect God's faithfulness and goodness to unfold before our very eyes. We welcome and encourage all to walk together in being who God has created us to be in this time and place. God has blessed us and bestowed on us many gifts and we acknowledge the call and responsibility we have to share those blessings and gifts with one another. We try but we don't' always get things right; therefore, we give thanks for God's gifts of grace and forgiveness and acknowledge the importance of offering grace to one another. May God continue to fill us and use us to bring glory to God's kingdom here on earth as it is in heaven.

## **Building Hospitality**

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. #### Come, the feast is prepared!... Seder Meal- April 17 @ 6 pm

You are invited to the table of our Lord for a celebration feast of Mediterranean Fare remembering "The Last Supper". Peter and crew will be preparing a scrumptious 3 course meal including some of the traditional elements of the first seder meals served during Passover; roast lamb and chicken, charoset, matza, humus, olives, etc. The meal is free and open to all who are able to come participate, including children. Please RSVP on the signup in the Foyer so we know how much food to prepare.

First Pres Presents will host its next event in the 2025 Fine Arts Series on Good Friday, April 18 @ 7 pm. Theodore Dubois' The Seven Last Words of Christ will be presented in eight movements: an introduction for soprano and orchestra followed by a movement for each of the seven words of Christ from the cross. At the end of the Seventh Word, Dubois concludes his sacred cantata with a hymn-like setting of the medieval hymn Adoramus Te, Christe. This serene hymn provides the listener with a foretaste of the resurrection after the compelling drama of the Passion story. This work will be performed by our Chancel Choir and soloists and will be accompanied by our organ and a chamber orchestra. Soloists will include: Grace Mead, soprano; Dr. Marcia Thom-Kaley, mezzo-soprano; Dr. Christopher Swanson, tenor; and Bennett Umhau, baritone. Brandon Mock will be our guest organist, and Josh O'Dell will be conducting. This concert is free for all and nursery care will be provided.
