Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ!!! It is so wonderful to be together as we worship God this morning. In the spirit of this Eastertide Season, three weeks removed from the glorious and celebrative Easter Sunday in which the tomb that once held Jesus' body is now empty, for Christ is Risen!, may we all remember that the beauty of God's goodness and glory surrounds us, God's mercy is new every morning, and the joy of the Lord shines like the noonday sun! I pray today, and the rest of this Eastertide Season, that you will feel and experience God's presence with you and know of the unconditional love and abounding hope that comes from our Lord.

PILLARS: Jesus preaches and teaches us about faith and life using parables, and there is one in particular found in Matthew 7:24-27 in which the structure of our life is compared to the structure of a house. Building Hospitality

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around.
