# Welcome to First Presbyterian Church-Lynchburg, VA

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus! I pray this note of welcome finds you well and filled with the joy of God's spirit. And if, for some reason, it does not, I pray you may feel and know of God's good gifts of love and peace and hope in this time and season of your life.

Today, I hope you will join me in welcoming The Reverend Vernie Bolden back to First Presbyterian for worship. Vernie is the pastor of 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue Presbyterian Church in Roanoke and serves as the Justice and Mercy Advocate for the Presbytery of the Peaks. Vernie is no stranger to First Presbyterian, as he filled in for me for four total weeks during my sabbatical in 2023. Vernie carries with him a passion to serve and teach and his ability to connect with the heart of the matter is undeniable. Our Presbytery has been and continues to be blessed by Vernie's leadership in a multitude of ways, and I am certain the blessing will continue for our time of worship today.

Just a note to recognize today, October 26<sup>th</sup>, as Reformation Sunday. Reformation Day is October 31 of every year. That is the day in 1517 when Dr. Martin Luther nailed his *95 Theses* to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. It was Luther's act that caused the initial furor that resulted in the Reformation. Luther had earned his Doctor of Theology degree in Wittenberg and was a respected professor there, as well as the assistant pastor of the Castle Church. Luther chose October 31 because it was the day before All Saints' Day. The Castle Church's front door opened on a main street of the city, and it was a good place to post a notice for public viewing. Luther knew that on the next day, November 1 — All Saints' Day — the church would be filled with worshipers, many of whom were educated and literate. His act of posting his *95 Theses* on the door was the equivalent of publishing a journal article, taking out a newspaper ad, or putting up an Internet website today. Reformation Day is most often observed today on the Sunday prior to October 31.

# **Building Hospitality and Welcoming Children**

In order to make the worship service as welcoming for our littlest ones as possible, we provide worship carts in the Narthex with a variety of resources to make a worship bag. Following the Children's Moment, children age 4 years to 2<sup>nd</sup> grade are invited to a Worship Workshop led by Abby Boyle, our new Worship Workshop Coordinator. Worship Workshop runs from post Children's Moment to the Benediction, with all participants being led from the Sanctuary to Room 1 (downstairs below Library) for activities and then back to the Narthex for pickup.
