Welcome to First Presbyterian Church-Lynchburg, VA

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus! The psalmist writes, "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it." (Psalm 118:24) I pray you are doing well today. It is so wonderful to be with you as we gather to worship and bring God praise, honor, and glory.

I have a question I want to ask. It has become more and more evident in language and behavior that God is someone we turn to for help when we need it. Like a doctor when we are sick or a pharmacist when we need medicine or a repair person when something breaks at home. "Help! God help!" God has indeed promised to be "our help" in ages past, present, and future. Here is the question: are we as well versed in our conversations and time with God when things are moving right along and going well? Perhaps another way of asking the question is, how well are we doing with living in gratitude and thanksgiving to God for all God is and all God does for us?

Like last week, we celebrate in worship today the theme of Thanksgiving. When Israel was preparing for a new life in the promised land, God gave them the instruction, "Celebrate the Feast of Harvest with the first fruits of the crops you sow in your field," (Exodus 23:16). Thanksgiving celebrations were an important part of the people's worship before God. Throughout history, worshiping communities have set aside certain times and days as events of special thanksgiving to God. These events are an acknowledgement that God, as creator, is also the provider of all the bounty of life. When special blessings are experienced, when fervent prayers have been answered, when times of prosperity come, or when God has led and protected through times of trial or uncertainty, the church does well to gather in thankful worship before God.

In order to make the worship service as welcoming for our littlest ones as possible, we provide worship carts in the Narthex with a variety of resources to make a worship bag. Following the Children's Moment, children age 4 years to 2nd grade are invited to a Worship Workshop led by Abby Boyle, our new Worship Workshop Coordinator. Worship Workshop runs from post Children's Moment to the Benediction, with all participants being led from the Sanctuary to Room 1 (downstairs below Library) for activities and then back to the Narthex for pickup.
