New Testament Reading: Hebrews 2:10-18 (based on the Modern English Version)

It was fitting that God, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, to make the Author of their salvation perfect through suffering. For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason, Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, saying:

"I will declare Your name to My brothers and sisters; in the midst of the congregation, I will praise You."

And again: "I will put My trust in Him."

And again: "Here am I and the children whom God has given Me."

Since therefore, the children share in flesh and blood, He likewise shares the same thing, so that through death He might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death.
