# Welcome to First Presbyterian Church-Lynchburg, VA

Welcome! It is a true blessing to have you in worship today on this Christmas Eve. What a glorious day and what a wonderful opportunity we have to worship God and fellowship in community together.

At Christmas, we remember and celebrate the nativity of Christ and the mystery of the incarnation. Whereas during Advent we anticipate the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies of the Messiah, at Christmas we identify with the angels who proclaimed, "Glory to God in the highest"; with the shepherds, who were afraid but nevertheless offered worship in awe of the good news; and with Mary, who responded in humility and pondered the meaning of these events in her heart.

The spirit of the worship and the visuals of the worship space change dramatically from the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent to the celebration of Christmas. White, yellow, and gold are the colors of Christmas, and many visual symbols and images- angels, candles, the star of peace, shepherds, the manger, and so on- come to mind. Christmas carols have their own built-in spirit of celebration. Celebrating Christmas as a season helps us both to enter into a meaning of the incarnation more fully than celebrating a single day and to focus on additional Scripture texts that explore the meaning of Christmas beyond the familiar words of Luke 2.

Christmas is the first in a series of celebrations (Christmas, Epiphany, the baptism of our Lord, and the transfiguration of Jesus) that affirm the identity of Jesus as not only fully human but also fully divine.
