Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ!!! It is a gift to be with you this morning to worship God and bring God praise and honor in prayer, song, and fellowship together. As we gather to worship today, I want you to know you are welcome here and that you are enough just as you are. Thanks be to God!

As a community of faith, we are all seeking to do our best in being faithful to God and it feels great to have others to walk along side in this journey. I pray you will find a place of purpose and belonging in the life and ministries of FPCLY and if I can help you specifically in any way, please let me know. Believe it or not, we are a mere 3 days away from Ash Wednesday, which marks the start of Lent. Lent is the season of 40 days leading up to Easter and the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord. That means today will be the final stop, at least this go around, to zero in on our theme of “Putting God First” and work together to unpack how that can be a real thing we experience throughout our life.

To jump start us back into rhythm, powerful and unforgettable words ring loud from Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6, “Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness.” This text serves as a climax in Jesus’ lifechanging sermon, and we are invited to embrace it with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. To unpack this text a little more, maybe we can consider where we are sitting and/or standing to view the things of life. Are we at sea level, in the trenches, at ground zero, perched on a hill, or nestled at a higher altitude? What does our view afford us and how is it effecting our ability to “Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness”?

An additional text we will encounter today is Joshua’s question to the Israelites, “Who is it you will serve?” Joshua’s declaration, “As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord!”, is a great charge for each of us to own and embody. May God be the one in which all our devotion, attention, praise, honor, and glory is given.

Building Hospitality and Welcoming Children

- The Nursery (ages 0 to 3) and Nursery Nook are located on this level through the Chapel in Room 101. A Nursery Care Provider is there to help assist you.
- Welcoming Children: Just as Jesus welcomes the little children to come, so we welcome children of all ages in worship. In order to make the worship service as welcoming for our littlest ones as possible, we provide worship carts in the Narthex with a variety of resources to make a worship bag. Following the Children’s Moment, children age 4 years to 2nd grade are invited to a Worship Workshop led by Abby Boyle, our Worship Workshop Coordinator. Worship Workshop runs from post Children’s Moment to the Benediction, with all participants being led from the Sanctuary to Room 1 (downstairs below Library) for activities and then back to the Narthex for pickup.
